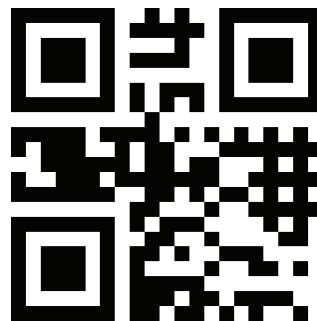


NYSIDDDNA Annual Conference

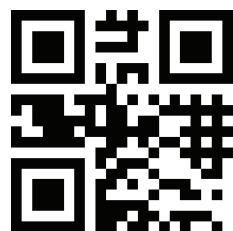
