## NYSIDDDNA Annual Conference

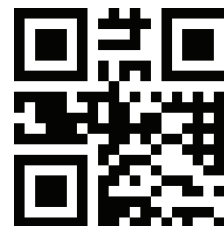

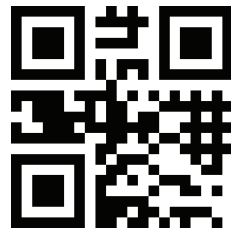
We believe by working together, outcomes will be better.
